



**Declaration of Intent
No-Gift Policy
Fiscal Year 2026**

I, Mr. Nutthapong Wongwiwat, Director-General of the Department of Medical Services, hereby declare the adoption of a No-Gift Policy and affirm the commitment of all executives, officials, and personnel of the Department of Medical Services to uphold this principle. The Department of Medical Services is an agency whose executives, officials, and personnel shall not accept any form of gifts or gratuities arising from the performance of their duties—whether before, during, or after carrying out official responsibilities—that may encourage corruption or misconduct, now or in the future.

We pledge to work collectively to foster an organizational culture grounded in honesty, integrity, and transparency, and to promote positive attitudes and values in the performance of public duties. We shall clearly distinguish between public and personal interests, consistently placing the public interest above personal interest. We shall cultivate public spirit, perform our duties with fairness and without discrimination, and refrain from any actions that may create a conflict of interest between public and personal interests.

We further commit to not accepting any asset or benefit, whether directly or indirectly, that may be converted into financial value beyond what is legitimately permitted under the laws, rules, or regulations issued under legal authority—except for gifts or benefits expressly allowed for ethical reasons, in accordance with the criteria and quantity determined by the National Anti-Corruption Commission.

We shall strictly adhere to the ethical standards of government officials, the Department of Medical Services' Code of Conduct, and the Department's guidelines on the giving or receiving of gifts or benefits for officials at all positions and levels, as well as all relevant laws, regulations, and Cabinet resolutions. Through this commitment, we aim to advance the goals of "Zero Corruption and wrongful Conducts of MOPH" and "MOPH Together Against Corruption."
